Action and Agenda Discussion Items:

❑ **TFJCK Coordinator Position**

- The group discussed the situation and timeline of Lisa's resignation from coordination of the coalition. She will no longer be in a coordinating role as of January 31, 2019. The coalition has ~\$25,000 to contract with someone as a part-time coordinator, starting on January 31. After some discussion, the group asked Monica to offer the position to Alex Galston, pending what happens with the other part-time contract he holds with UW-Extension. If he does not accept the contract, Monica will let the Leadership Team know so they can advertise in the community.
- The coalition wants a formal contract and position description for the coordinator position and for Lisa's on-going financial contract.
- The time period of the contract will be a time when the coalition leadership plans, prioritizes, and potentially restructures to accommodate limited staffing.

❑ **Opioid Abuse Prevention**

- State Targeted Response Menu Project
 - BRFPD Drug Box – in place, paid for
 - Lock Boxes, Lock Bags, Deactivation Kits – Continue distributing. Barb will check with the Emergency Room staff, and Kristi will check with Black River Pharmacy to see if they want some to distribute. Alex and Monica will be distributing some at the Veteran Benefits and Resource Fair as well as an upcoming Health Fair.
 - Dose of Reality – With additional funding, we will schedule another billboard and plan to boost some Facebook ads.
 - Drug Take Back Events – The City PD and County Sheriff's Dept. are both hosting Take Back events on October 20. We are helping to promote and will collect data back to report to the state.

❑ **HWPP**

- Campaign – The campaign launched on August 1 and more posts have been coming out on Instagram and Snapchat since school started. Coalition leaders are asked to help promote with teen audiences.
- Landing Page – help promote social media – momenttobreathe.org

❑ **Strengthening Families (Oct. 2-Dec. 4) – at Red Creek Elementary**

- SFP 4-10 – This one starts October 2 and we have 6-7 families signed up already. It's being promoted widely. Keep it up!
- MSFP 11-14 – This one starts October 25 and will run on the same schedule as the other session after that. Promotions will ramp up after October 1 to avoid confusion with the other program.

❑ **Suicide Prevention**

- QPR
 - For Law Enforcement – September 24 and 27, 4-5PM both days at City Hall
 - For Ho-Chunk Nation Youth Services and the community – September 25 at 6PM at the District 1 Community Center; dinner will be served beforehand
 - For County Employees – September 26, 11:30AM-12:30PM in the County Boardroom
 - More sessions being planned:

- For Bartenders
- For the faith community and Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers
- For community parents (BRF, Lincoln, Mel-Min) before the Youth QPR sessions
- Youth QPR
 - BRFHS – October 30-31
 - Lincoln – November 15
 - Mel-Min - TBD
- **Needle Box (funding update)** – Black River Memorial Hospital contributed \$100 and Public Health contributed \$100 to help get us through this year. Then after January 1, 2019, Jackson County Environmental Services (recycling) will take over supervision of the drop box.
- **Tobacco Free Coalition** –
 - Meeting coming up at the Gathering Grounds on September 12 at 8:30AM
 - Teens Against Tobacco Use is off and running, getting sessions set up with the schools and ready for training
 - Hosting Dr. Bruce Christiansen to teach “The Bucket Approach” on October 4, 8:15AM-12:30PM. Behavioral health providers will learn an evidence-based strategy to help individuals with mental health challenges quit smoking even as they address their mental health.
- **Taking Care of You**
 - Current session being conducted at Aptiv for staff members through the end of September.
 - 3 sessions are being scheduled over the next several months – Two will be 4-week, 2 hour/week sessions, and one will be an 8-week, 1 hour/week session during the lunch hour.
- **Teens Against Bullying Others (TABO)**
 - Kelly Labar reported that both BRF and Lincoln School Districts are still interested in TABO. She is working with her new Program Coordinator, Nate Skar, to determine if he can take on the program at both schools or just one.
- **Miscellaneous:**
 - AODA grant- Yes, received this grant. Will pay for QPR, SFP, other tobacco products education, TABO, and mindfulness education in the schools. \$15,000/year
 - Foundation Grant- Yes. Will pay for SFP gas cards, meals, and advertising
 - TFJCK Minutes/Agendas/meeting coordination – who’s next? – Barb Brower will take care of the agenda, meeting notice and minutes for October. Public Health will take care of these for November.
